## Communication

- Communication breakdown is one of the main reasons that couples seek counselling.
- Set aside time to talk when you won't be interrupted.
- Make sure both of you have the freedom to talk openly – set a timer so you each have five minutes.
- Tell your partner how you are feeling about something, without placing the blame on them – that way you own your feelings.

# Why doesn't my wife want our baby?

But I've since found a pill packet and know she is still using contraception. I'm so confused because she suggested having a baby, and I thought it was what we both wanted. I'm really angry – what should I do?

**A** Mo Kurimbokus also had this advice: "For Jake to feel angry and confused at being misled is understandable, but Becca may also be confused too.

"Jake says Becca has been distant and off sex for a while now, and this suggests she may not be happy about something or feels her needs are not being met. Sex is often a casualty when this happens.

"The two of them need a heart-to-heart. Jake should express disappointment over Becca still being on the pill and ask her what she feels is missing from the relationship. Listen to each other, try to understand the other's point of view – and be supportive.

"Remember, if he is asking Becca to be open and honest about how she feels, Jake must be prepared to listen and accept what his wife has to say him." ●
